Comparing and contrasting locations using primary and secondary sources

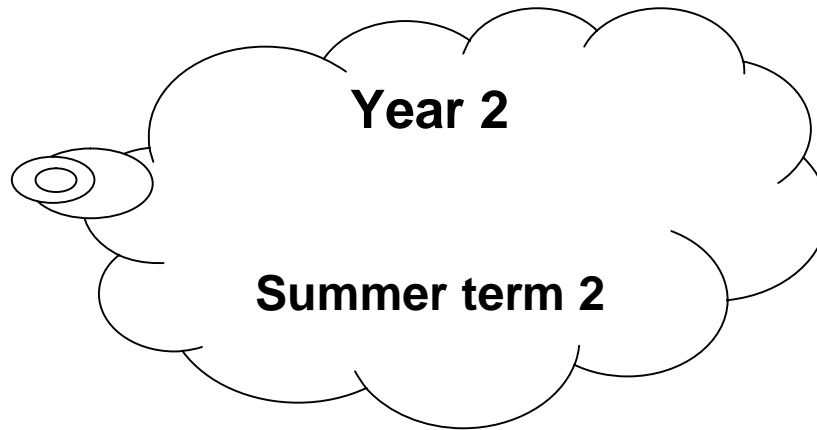
PSHE: Changes
